Registering and using the National Library's services

- Procedure for persons seeking international protection

The National Library of Luxembourg (BnL) would hereby like to inform persons seeking international protection that they are able to register with the library and to take advantage of all services offered: online reservations via the *a-z.lu* search engine, home loans, online and on-site consultation of resources. It is possible to register for the BnL, to borrow items and to consult resources online for free.

A special user card has been developed for persons in need of international protection. Valid for six months, it can be renewed as necessary. To register, they simply need to present their certificate of application of international protetion (attestation de dépôt), which is also known as the "fiche rose".

Users are able to research, reserve and borrow resources to aid them in their endeavours to learn the languages spoken in Luxembourg. These include multimedia language training (English, French, German, Luxemburgish, etc.) and reference materials, such as bilingual dictionaries (Arabic–French, Arabic–English) in addition to grammar books.

In its role as an encyclopaedic study library, the BnL is offering international multilingual publications on all subject areas. Furthermore, Luxembourgish publications (known as *Luxemburgensia*) allow new residents to familiarise themselves with the institutions, history and cultural life in Luxembourg and thus also with their host country.
