

Guy Arendt

Secretary of State for Culture

Guy Arendt was born on 13 April 1954 in Luxembourg City.

Education and qualifications

Following secondary school studies at the Athénée de Luxembourg (classical languages section), Guy Arendt pursued higher education studies at the University of Nancy II, where he was awarded a master's degree in private law in 1979.

Governmental posts

Following the legislative elections of 20 October 2013, Guy Arendt was elected to Parliament. He joined the government as Secretary of State for Culture on 18 December 2015 in the coalition government formed by the Democratic Party (DP), the Luxembourg Socialist Workers' Party (LSAP) and the Green Party ("déli gréng").

Other political posts

A member of the DP since 1980, Guy Arendt was elected to Parliament for the first time in 2013 while standing for the DP in the constituency of the Centre. In Parliament, he was a member of several committees and chaired the Committee for Housing.

At local level, Guy Arendt served as a municipal councillor in Walferdange from 1992 to 1999. Following the municipal elections of 1999, he initially served as an alderman from 2000 to 2002, before assuming the role of mayor in 2003, an office he held until his appointment to the government in December 2015.

Professional activities

Guy Arendt worked as a barrister in Luxembourg from 1980 to 2015. He served as chairman of the Luxembourg Bar Council from 2006 to 2007.
